



# What's the Rate?

## What You Need


- Pencil and paper clip
- What's the Rate? Spinner
- What's the Rate? Unit Cards
- What's the Rate? Money Cards

## How to Play


- Play with a partner or in a small group.
- Shuffle the Unit Cards and the Money Cards, and place each set face down in a pile.
- Each player takes a Unit Card and a Money Card.
- One player spins the spinner for the group. The number the spinner lands on tells each player how many of the items on their Unit Card to buy.
- Each player figures out how much it would cost to buy that number of the item shown on their Unit Card.
- Each player keeps track of how much they spend on each turn. The first player to spend a total of \$150 or more wins.

## Example

The spinner lands on 4.




Brianna takes these two cards:



If 2 toy cars cost \$10, then 4 toy cars cost twice as much. So 4 toy cars cost \$20.

Fernanda takes these two cards:




If 5 packages of golf balls cost \$40, then 1 package costs \$8. That means 4 packages cost  $4 \times \$8 = \$32$ .






