1. Purpose

The purpose of this administrative procedure is to ensure compliance with nutrition standards for food and beverages sold in Durham Catholic District School Board schools.

- 3.1 Using the guidelines provided in the Ministry of Education School Food and Beverage Policy Resource Guide, the Board shall:
- 3.1.1 support school principals in monitoring compliance with provincial nutrition standards for foods provided for sale in schools;
- 3.2 School principals shall:
- 3.2.2 consult with Catholic School Councils prior to designating up to ten specialevent days on which food and beverages sold in schools would be exempt from the nutrition standards; and
- 3.2.3 encourage the consumption of municipal water on site and cooperate with student led initiatives to eliminate the use of bottled water.
- 3.3 With the support of Purchasing Services, principals and managers shall ensure that all food services contractors and vendors meet the requirements of this policy and administrative procedure.
